Regional Transport Plan Consultation - Have Your Say!

Transport plays a vital role in our daily lives, shaping how we access work, education, healthcare, and leisure. In recognition of its importance, the <u>Mid Wales Corporate Joint Committee</u> is developing a **Regional Transport Plan (RTP)** to identify how they will contribute to the delivery of the Welsh Governments National Transport Strategy and transform transportation in the region.

The draft RTP sets an ambitious vision to create a sustainable, low-carbon, and efficient transport system. It will focus on improving connectivity within and beyond Mid Wales while tackling challenges unique to our rural landscape.

Key objectives of the RTP include:

- Increasing access to sustainable transport modes such as cycling, walking, and public transport.
- Enhancing transport links to drive economic and tourism growth.
- Supporting efforts to reduce carbon emissions and combat climate change.

The RTP is being developed in partnership with Ceredigion and Powys County Councils, guided by the Welsh Government's <u>Llwybr Newydd: Wales Transport Strategy 2021</u>. Public consultation is a critical step in the process, offering you an opportunity to shape the final plan.



Key highlights from the Mid Wales Regional Transport Plan



Ambitious Vision for Transport


The Regional Transport Plan (RTP) is a roadmap for improving transport in Mid Wales, focusing on creating a sustainable, efficient, and low-carbon transport system. It supports access to jobs, education, healthcare, and leisure while aiming to tackle climate change.



2 - Mid Wales Strategic Road Network: The rural nature of the area affects the availability of bus services as many services do not operate or operate limited connections in smaller communities compared to the larger towns across Mid Wales. For example, only a quarter of the Mid Wales population live less than a 400m walking distance from a bus stop with at least one bus per hour.

Why This Matters


The Plan aligns with <u>Llwybr Newydd: The Wales Transport Strategy 2021</u>, aiming for 45% of journeys to be made by public transport, walking, or cycling by 2040. It addresses unique rural challenges, ensuring better connectivity for isolated communities and supporting tourism and business growth.



3 - Inter-regional flows within Wales: In terms of connectivity within Wales, this figure shows the importance of flows between Mid Wales and South West Wales, with flows between the two regions accounting for 38% of all Am Peak interregional trips within Wales in 2022 (covering all modes and journey purposes).

RTP Objectives

- To become more sustainable by shifting to sustainable modes like public transport, cycling, and walking.
- Enhance connectivity to boost economic and tourism growth.
- Reduce environmental impacts through greener transport solutions, like promoting ultra-low-emission vehicles.



4 - Access to services: This figure shows the extent of the Mid Wales region that falls within the 10% most deprived category when considering access to services. The data reflects the rural nature of the region, dispersed settlement patterns, the need to travel longer distances to access key services, and the limited public transport options available.

Opportunities for Stakeholders

Collaboration with the Mid Wales Growth Deal, linking transport improvements to broader economic strategies. Funding opportunities for active travel initiatives and sustainable transport projects.



5 - In developing the MWRTP, consideration has been taken on how the five ways of working, as set out in the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015, can be followed.

Next Steps

Following public consultation, the final RTP will guide transport investments and policies for the next five years. The final document will be made available in summer 2025 and funding released in 2026/7.

The Integrated Well-being Assessment, accompanying the Plan, ensures all changes prioritise community health and sustainability.
