Mid Wales Regional Skills Partnership - Summer Highlights

It's been a busy few months for the Mid Wales Regional Skills Partnership, with activity across all sectors.

- Construction and Manufacturing/Engineering clusters met in Llandrindod Wells, with thanks to Kiernan Steel for hosting and providing an insightful tour.
- Green skills were a focus as NPTC Group of Colleges and Coleg Sir Gâr | Coleg Ceredigion presented their Green Skills Academy to the Construction cluster.
- We joined Robert Price Builders' Merchants in Brecon for a retrofit event, and attended the Business Wales Procurement Roadshow in Aberystwyth to hear about new initiatives for local SMEs.
- The Food and Drink Business Leader Network met at Rhosygilwen Mansion, with Antur Cymru Enterprise highlighting financial support available for workforce development.
- The Agriculture, Forestry & Horticulture cluster, hosted by Mentera, welcomed Woodknowledge Wales to explore skills and CPD opportunities in forestry.
- Across all cluster groups, interactive skills challenges helped identify what sectors really need.

We also helped launch this year's Powys Business Awards — sponsoring the new Business-Education Partnership Award — and took part in the Growing Mid Wales Energy Stakeholder event at the Royal Welsh Show, alongside Farming Connect's launch of their new CPD record platform, *Storfa Sgiliau*.

The clear message: collaboration between education, industry, and policy is key to a thriving skills landscape in Mid Wales.

Shared Prosperity Fund in action

The Cynnal y Cardi Grant which is funded by the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund is still open:

Support for communities and businesses in Ceredigion

Two grants offering funding opportunities are available:

- Cynnal y Cardi Community Development and Support Fund (1,000 and up to £50,000.): Providing support to communities which includes revenue expenditure and small capital improvements.
- Cynnal y Cardi Capital Business Fund (£5,000 and up to £50,000.): Providing support for capital expenditure projects and specialist revenue expenditure to assist businesses to develop economically.

Both funds will welcome applications under a first come, first serve basis between 18 June 2025and 30 September 2025, or until the fund is fully allocated.

Meanwhile, in Powys, SPF funding continues to make a tangible impact—supporting 71 local businesses through Powys County Council's Business Growth Grant scheme. Notably, CastAlum, an aluminium parts manufacturer in Welshpool, received £25,000 to update two of its die-cast machines as part of its refurbishment programme.

We're now wrapping up the Viability Stage of the process, with final evaluations of proposals nearing completion. An Evaluation Panel will meet shortly after to agree on outcomes, which will inform the next steps. Decisions on which projects will move forward will be made by the Portfolio Delivery Board, with feedback shared with all applicants soon after. This will lead into a short pause to allow for any follow-up questions or clarifications, ahead of a wider update being shared later.

WLGA Rural Wales Manifesto



The Welsh Local Government Association has published a new *Rural Wales Manifesto*, calling for stronger recognition of the unique opportunities and challenges facing rural communities. It sets out key priorities for future policy and investment, highlighting the need for tailored approaches to economic development, transport, housing, and digital connectivity across rural areas like Mid Wales.
