Innovative dairy farm leads the way in ethical farming and skills sharing across Mid Wales



Dyfi Dairies is blazing a trail for the future of dairy farming in Mid Wales. As the first cowwith-calf dairy in Wales, founder Sophia has pioneered a model that places animal welfare, mental health, and long-term sustainability at its heart.

Part of the <u>Agri-tech and Food Technology Clusters</u> for Mid and North Wales and supported by New Innovators funding through Innovate UK and additional LEAP* funding via

AberInnovation, <u>Dyfi Dairies</u> has grown from a bold idea into a practical, thriving system that others are now keen to follow.

While their farmland is located in Powys, their processing facility lies just over the county border in Ceredigion - a fitting representation of their cross-regional impact. The farm recently secured a lifetime tenancy agreement, offering stability to continue developing and expanding their unique approach.




COMING SOON – Careers in 360 portal

SPF in Focus: Capital Investment and Project Highlights

Capital grants for business available, worth up to £25k

Powys businesses, and those moving to the county, can apply for a new round of capital grants worth between £5,000 and £25,000.

They are being offered by Powys County Council and funded by the UK Government's Shared Prosperity Fund.

The Powys Business Capital Grants can be used to:

- support the purchase of equipment that boosts productivity or enables the creation of new products or services, or
- support investment in greener technologies, such as replacing existing lighting or heating systems with more sustainable alternatives.

Expressions of interest must be submitted by Monday 15 September, with successful businesses then expected to submit their full applications before the end of Friday 3 October.


Five successful graduates started in post on 1st September. We wish them every success as they begin their careers with Ceredigion Council.

Recently, the Centre for Alternative Technology (CAT) was delighted to welcome Cllr Bryan Davies and Cllr Jake Berriman, leaders of Ceredigion and Powys County Councils, for a site visit and progress update on the flagship capital development project, Cynefin: Green Heart of Wales.

During their visit, the council leaders met with CAT Co-CEO Eileen Kinsman to hear about recent milestones in the Cynefin project and discuss its future impact. The visit included a guided tour of the site and a presentation outlining the project's achievements to date and the exciting next steps.

Rhydlewis Exchange hits 100% target for community fibre project



Rhydlewis Exchange hits 100% target for community fibre project

On 08 September, Openreach confirmed that the Rhydlewis Exchange project has now reached 100% of its revised community funding target – a huge milestone for one of the most rural and dispersed areas of Ceredigion.

The exchange, which serves 1,058 premises across 127 postcodes, had some of the lowest fibre coverage in the county, with just 30% of homes and businesses able to access Full Fibre (FTTP). Despite geographical challenges and setbacks caused by storm damage earlier this year, local residents have worked together to raise £1.4 million in pledges to ensure fibre rollout will reach every eligible property.

So far, 154 premises are already "Ready for Service," with work continuing across the catchment. The build is due to complete later this year, bringing transformational connectivity to homes and businesses in Rhydlewis.

Rhydlewis was first highlighted in our article on the opportunities for a <u>digital revolution in Mid Wales</u> last year. This latest milestone shows what's possible when rural communities come together to secure investment in their digital future – and offers encouragement to others still working towards their own targets in Velindre, Maesycrugiau, and Llandysul.

See if you're in a Voucher Priority Area - Some areas in Mid Wales, including Llandysul, Maesycrugiau, and Newcastle Emlyn, qualify for government-funded broadband vouchers. In Powys, Community Fibre Partnerships are expanding coverage.

If you're in an eligible area, signing up could help influence broadband expansion plans and secure funding for better connectivity at no personal cost. You can check your eligibility and register your interest at: <u>Connect My Community</u>


Join Global Welsh online on 18th September for a first-of-a-kind event to kick-start the conversation and explore what Wales has to offer your business.
